

Dr. Walsh will provide a research-based approach, and her goal is to provide practical and easily accessible guidelines and conversation starters that families can use at home.





Teachers involved in the STEAM Expo are expecting over 40 scientific projects, ranging from properties of matter, a functional hoverboard, taste testing for rats (and more!) – all to be presented by over 50 students in grades 6-8.

The district-wide Art Department, the Orchard Park Visual Arts Boosters, and district-wide Technology and Math teachers will all be providing hands-on STEAM activities such as flying drones, 3d printing, VR race cars, kite making, spinning tops, and more. The Science Department will be running an immersive planetarium experience for all attendees.

Educational Outreach Club Assembles Care Packages for Family Solutions Center









Students in the Orchard Park High School Educational Outreach Club recently partnered with Dignity Grows, a program of the Buffalo Jewish Federation, to assemble feminine care packages to benefit the Orchard Park Family Solutions Center.

Dignity Grows provides individuals in need with essential personal hygiene products so they can attend school, work, and participate in community life without interruption. According to Dignity Grows, "Human dignity should not be considered a luxury, yet more than 30% of menstruators in the U.S. suffer from period poverty, lacking financial resources to purchase basic feminine hygiene necessities." Dignity Grows raises funds to purchase supplies and mobilizes volunteers to organize, assemble, and distribute free, discreet reusable zipper-top totes filled with menstrual products as well as a month's supply of soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, and shaving products.

Club advisors Rachel Adel and Kathleen Holtermann brought the idea of partnering with Dignity Grows to the Educational Outreach Club and students were enthusiastic about getting involved to support this worthwhile cause. On Wednesday, February 7, 2024, members of Dignity Grows brought supplies to OPHS and the students were able to assemble more than 200 feminine care packages to be donated to the Orchard Park Family Solutions Center.

The Educational Outreach Club is committed to "lending a helping hand at home and in the global community."

### ZeroEyes

The Orchard Park Central School District has recently launched ZeroEyes to proactively bolster District security. Over the last decade, the Orchard Park Central School District has worked diligently to enhance its safety protocols. The District continually researches the latest available

analytics platform. They are the only platform to hold the US Department of Homeland Security SAFETY Act Designation.

In early February, the detection and intelligent situational awareness platform began serving and assisting in the protection of Orchard Park students, staff, and visitors. ZeroEyes will complement the schools' existing layered security measures, which include secure vestibules, visitor screenings, access control, a single point of entry, School Resource Officers (SROs), and more.



ZeroEyes' Al gun detection and intelligent situational awareness software integrates with the District's security systems. If a firearm is identified, images will instantly be shared with the ZeroEyes Operations Center (ZOC), staffed 24/7/365 by specially trained U.S. military and law enforcement veterans. If these experts determine that the threat is valid, they will dispatch alerts and actionable intelligence to local law enforcement and the school security team in as fast as 3 to 5 seconds from detection.

"At ZeroEyes, we strive to offer the least intrusive approach to addressing gun-related violence to preserve the traditional school atmosphere that children deserve," said Mike Lahiff, CEO and cofounder of ZeroEyes. "We are proud to support Orchard Park Central School District's proactive measures to ensure the well-being and safety of its students and staff."

"The ZeroEyes team understands the District's dedication to keeping students safe while ensuring a warm and welcoming environment," said David Lilleck, Superintendent of Orchard Park Central School District. " With ZeroEyes, we can focus on maximizing the full potential of each student, knowing that their safety is in good hands."
