Orchard Park High School Recognized as 2022 National Blue Ribbon School



On Friday, September 16, 2022 U.S. Secretary of Education Miguel Cardona recognized 297 schools, including Orchard Park High School, <u>National Blue Ribbon Schools</u>. Orchard Park High School is one of

twenty schools selected for this honor in New York State.

National Blue Ribbon Schools serve as models of effective school practices for state and district educators and other schools throughout the nation. A National Blue Ribbon School flag gracing a school's entryway or on a flagpole is a widely recognized symbol of exemplary teaching and learning.



Orchard Park High School has been named among the Exemplary High-Performing Schools for the second time.

"On behalf of Orchard Park High School's staff, students, and families, we are incredibly proud to be recognized as a 2022 National Blue Ribbon School. said Orchard Park High School Principal Jonathan Wolf. Parent Information Series Kicks Off With Executive Functioning Presentation

The Orchard Park Central School District will kick off the 2022-2023 Parent Information Series with a virtual presentation: *Executive Functioning*, given by Dr. Peg Dawson.

Executive skills are critical to the acquisition of academic skills, but, more importantly, they are the skills students need to get things done. They are brain-based skills such as task initiation, sustained attention, working memory, planning, organization, and goal-directed persistence that are critical to school success. Some students seem to acquire them



naturally, but many students struggle with them. Dr. Peg Dawson will describe how these skills develop throughout childhood and suggest strategies parents can use to help children acquire the critical skills they need to be successful students.

By recognizing the family as the most significant influence in the development of a child, mental health professionals will optimize student success by empowering families.

"We understand that the family is the most important aspect in the development of the child and by assisting families with improved communication, conflict resolution and reducing stress in the functioning of the family, it will have a positive impact on the child's overall academic, social and emotional development." said Katie Connelly, Family Solutions Center Coordinator.

Eggert Students Study "How Living Things Get What They Need To Live and Grow"






